The obligation for the faithful to attend Holy Mass on a Sunday or Holy Day of Obligation is suspended.

#### WELCOME EVERYONE

Each time you attend Mass in person you will be required to complete a 'Track & Trace' form. In addition, please note the following guidance and engage with all of the instructions:

- 1. Sanitise your hands and follow the one-way system.
- 2. Face coverings & two metres social distancing are mandatory.
- 3. Switch off, or place into airline mode, any mobile devices.
- 4. Go straight to your seat on entry and do not engage in conversation with anyone except those from your household.
- 5. Ensure that there are at least two seats between yourself or your household and another person or household.
- 6. There will be no exchange of the Sign of Peace.
- 7. At the invitation to holy communion all join saying 'Amen' as the celebrant presents the host and the chalice from the altar.
- 8. Nothing will be said, and thus no response is necessary, if you come forward to receive Christ in the Blessed Sacrament.
- 9. After Mass please put your kneeler on your chair and leave the Cathedral while maintaining two metres social distance.
- 10. Place your Mass sheet in the bin or take it home with you and put your offering/collection money in the receptacle provided.
