WELCOME EVERYONE

Each time you attend Mass in person you will be required to complete a 'Track & Trace' form. In addition, please note the following guidance and engage with all of the instructions:

- There will be no offer made to exchange the Sign of Peace.
- 7. Holy Communion will continue to be given under one kind.
- 8. At holy communion the minister will announce individually 'The Body of Christ', to which the recipient responds 'Amen' and then receives the sacred host.
- 9. After Mass please put your kneeler on your chair and leave the Cathedral while maintaining one metre social distancing.
- 10. Place your Mass sheet in the bin or take it home with you and put your offering/collection money in the receptacle provided.

TODAY'S CELEBRATION

Trinity Sunday is one of the few feasts in the Christian calendar that celebrate a doctrine rather than an event. The doctrine of the Trinity, whilst being one of the most difficult ideas in Christianity, is fundamental to Christians because it:

states what Christians believe God is like and who he is; plays a central part in Christians' worship of an 'unobjectifiable and incomprehensible God';

emphasises that God is very different from human beings; reflects the ways Christians believe God encounters them; is a central element of Christian identity;

teaches Christians vital truths about relationship and community; reveals that God can be seen only as a spiritual experience whose mystery inspires awe and cannot be understood logically.

HONOURING SACRIFICE

A new species of screech owl was recently discovered deep in the Amazon forest by a multinational team of researchers. Dubbed the Xingu screech owl, the little creature was given a scientific name of Megascops stangiae in honour of a Sister of Notre Dame de Namur, Dorothy Stang, who was assassinated in 2005 in Anapu in Pará, Brazil, while fighting for the Amazon forest and its people. Her congregation, as well as the researchers who discovered the new species, say naming the owl after the woman who dedicated most of her life to the people of the Amazon region is befitting.
